

Reelworld Film Festival announces *Simply Johanne* as its 2024 Outstanding Feature Film Award recipient, *A Good Day Will Come* as its 2024 Outstanding Short Film Award recipient, and *Stealing Vows* as its 2024 Audience Choice Award recipient

Toronto, ON - November 12, 2024

The 2024 Reelworld Film Festival+Summit came to a close on November 3 after one week of in-person screenings and events, and two days of virtual panels and mixers. Select films were available to watch online from October 22 to November 3.

Every year, Reelworld presents awards in 15 different categories to films that screened at the festival. The awards are selected by a jury, composed of three jurors for the shorts and three for the feature films. This year, Reelworld is proud to present over \$40,000 in cash prizes to the recipients of its festival awards. The Outstanding Feature Film award recipient receives \$20,000; the Outstanding Short Film award recipient receives \$10,000; and the Audience Choice Award recipient receives \$2,000. All short film award recipients receive \$750, and feature film award recipients receive \$1000.

"Congratulations to all this year's award recipients. At Reelworld we know the impact an award can have on any career, but it's especially crucial for Indigenous and racialized creators and talent who are often overlooked," said Tonya Williams, Founder and Executive Director of Reelworld Screen Institute. "An award offers national and international recognition, helps with access to funding, and can attract strong talent and collaborators for future projects."

This year's Outstanding Feature Film Award recipient is *Simply Johanne*, directed by Nadine Valcin. The Outstanding Short Film is *A Good Day Will Come*, directed by Amir Zargara. The Audience Choice Award recipient is *Stealing Vows* (the festival's Opening Night film), directed by Bobby Singh Brown. The full list of award recipients is below.

Screenwriter

Mary Galloway, a two-time CSA nominee, illuminates marginalized stories with heart and flair. Named a TIFF Rising Star and featured on *The Hollywood Reporter*'s Breakouts list, she created the celebrated web series *Querencia* in 2021. A CFC Directors' Lab and WBD Access x Canadian Academy Directors Program alumna, Galloway has directed impactful projects, including the CBC's *The Cowichan Sweater*.
